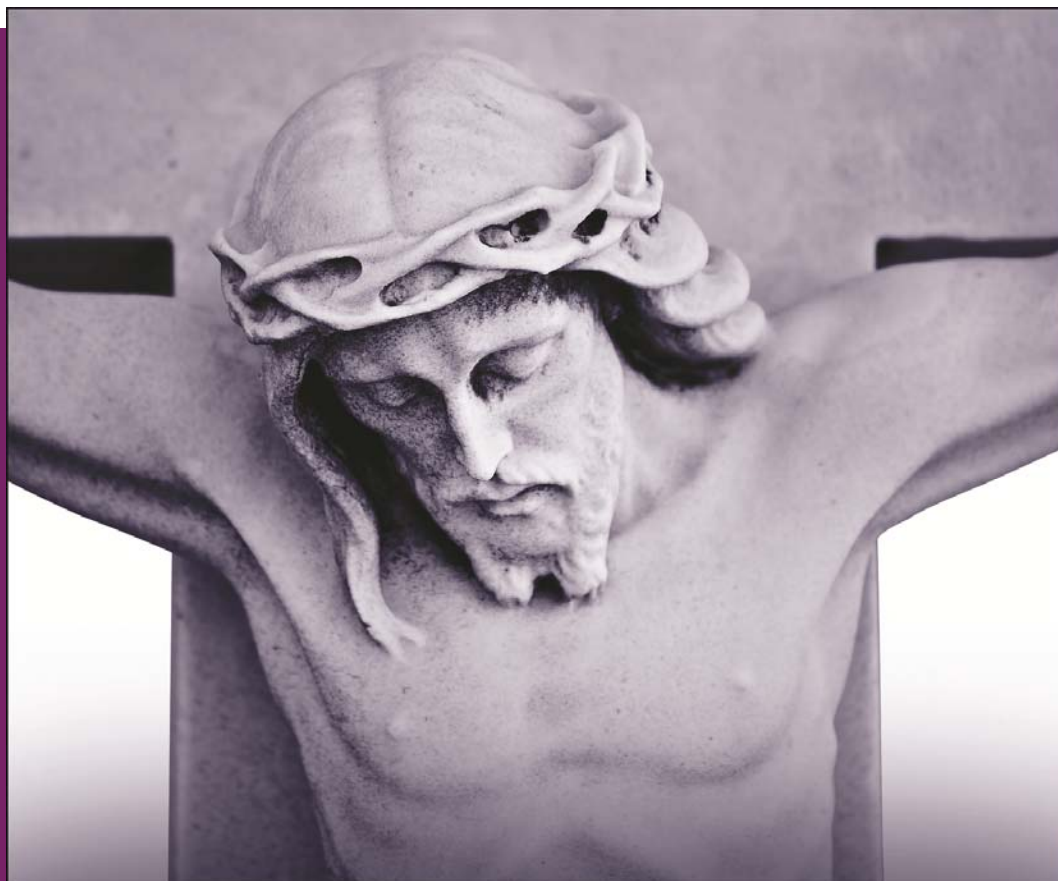

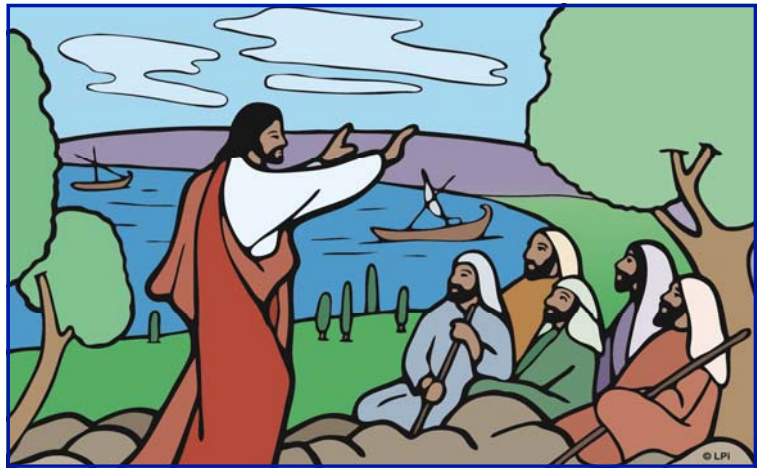

## Fr. Tom's Tidbits

During Lent, there will be a Mass on Tuesday evenings at 7PM. The Masses will be February 28th, March 6th, 13th, 20th, and 27th (Parish Mission), and April 3rd. Stations of the Cross will be at 12PM (Noon) and 7PM on Fridays during Lent beginning February 24th. Catholics who are fourteen years and older, do not eat meat on Fridays.

If you took the Little Black Book, hopefully, you are reading it during your Lenten journey. Each day during Lent, the Little Black Book provides a six minute reflection.

The Parish Mission will be Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, March 27th, 28th, and 29th. Father Dominic Grassi will be the presenter. On Tuesday and Thursday nights, his talk will take place during Mass. On Wednesday night, there will be a Reconciliation Service in preparation for Holy Week and Easter. Please mark your calendars, and save these dates.

If there is an adult (18 years old, or graduated from High School) in our Parish,

who was baptized Catholic, and received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation, but was not Confirmed, there will be an Adult Confirmation at St. Francis de Sales on Wednesday, June 6, 2012. In order to be Confirmed, you must attend several classes. The classes will be held at St. Mary of the Annunciation Parish beginning the end of March. If you are interested in being Confirmed, please contact the Rectory for more information.

The Second Graders of our Parish Grade School and Religious Education Program, are preparing to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on Saturday, March 10th. Please pray for the children in their days of preparation for this Sacrament.

There are several adults in our Parish who will be receiving Sacraments at the Easter Vigil Mass for their reception into the Catholic Church. Their journey of faith began in September, and focused on the Bible, the teachings and rituals of the



Catholic Church, prayer, and the sacraments. Today (Sunday), they are going to Holy Name Cathedral, and in the presence of the Bishop, family, friends, and other adults throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago, publically declare their desire to become Catholic at the Easter Vigil Mass. Please remember in your prayers all those adults throughout the world who are preparing to become Catholic at the Easter Vigil Mass.

## New Adult Education Program Begins This Tuesday!

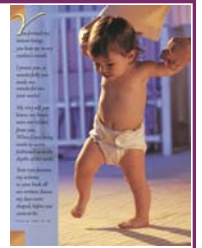

## Sacred Silence Before Mass During Lent

During Lent, our celebration of the Mass takes on a more penitential mood. Our Church is somber in purple, we begin Mass on our knees in silence, we chant our *Holy, the Mystery of Faith, Amen, and Agnus Dei*. It has been requested that we set that mood as soon as we enter the doors of our Church by being quiet, respectful, and keeping a sacred silence. To support this request, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Chapter II, *"The Structure of The Mass, Its' Elements, and Its' Parts"*, Section 45, *"Silence"* states:

*"Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its' nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act, and again after the invitation to pray, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts, and pray to Him.*

*Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the Church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner."*

And so during Lent, you are invited to take time from your hectic schedule, from the many things on your mind, from worries and concerns of the day...for sacred silence with Our Lord before Mass.

## Religious Education News

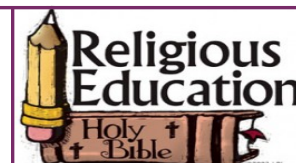
Our Religious Education students return to classes this Sunday and Monday after a week off for the observance of Presidents' Day. We normally have a palm burning ceremony the Sunday and Monday before Ash Wednesday, but because of the holiday, we burned palms a week early. Our students were fascinated by the leaping flames, the columns of smoke, and, once the ashes were gathered, how a large mound of dried palm leaves produce only enough ashes to fill the bottom of a zip-lock sandwich bag!

As dramatic as our palm burning was, I wondered if we could possibly compete with the performances many of our students saw that Sunday night on the televised Grammy Awards. The context of one of the staged songs, presented by a female rap star looking for as much notoriety as possible, was an exorcism, replete with imagery that was both frightening and shockingly dishonest in its' portrayal of religious observance. And honestly, we can't compete "*event for event*" with the videos and performances our children are bombarded with day-in and day-out. **What we CAN do**, bit by bit, is ground our students in prayer, in God's love, and in the compelling stories of the Bible that never fail to prod our imaginations, and nurture our souls.

In order to provide the context and grounding that our students need, we have been taking them to Church regularly this year, whether it is to Mass on Sundays, or for prayer and discussion on Mondays. We have certainly appreciated the generosity of spirit we have received from regular Mass goers at the 9AM and 11AM liturgies. Occasionally, our students get restless, and their murmurs are no longer whispers, but this is part of the process of orienting them to communal worship. Until this year, many of our students had never been in our sanctuary. Many, of whatever age or background, do not attend Mass regularly, if at all. We are on a spiritual journey with our students, and we are happy to have you all along!

This Sunday's first reading is the establishment of God's Rainbow Covenant with Noah and his descendants. The message in this passage from Genesis is simple: "*God keeps faith, as we keep faith.*" And as Catholic Christians, we have a community covenant as well. We promise to be a community united in the Eucharist, and in our belief as expressed in our Creeds. Despite our faults and failings, we are still God's children together, in Church and in the wider world.

NEXT SATURDAY, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, is our Confirmation Retreat. Our 8<sup>th</sup> Graders from the Parish School and Religious Education Program will gather from 9AM until 6PM to explore the meaning of the Sacrament of Confirmation, and how they will carry their faith throughout their lives. At the end of the Retreat, the Confirmandi will attend the 5PM Mass, together with wider community of the Parish. If you are at the 5PM Mass, please welcome them. They will build the next generation of our Parish in the decades to come.
