Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Children's Liturgy of the Word Program at the 9AM and 11AM Sunday liturgies, is taking a break for the summer. We will return on Sunday, September 11th. This program is designed for children ages 3-7 who have not yet made their First Communion, and are attending Mass with their families. The children and their catechists go to a separate room for stories and other activities for twenty minutes or so, before returning to Mass for the Eucharistic Prayer. During the Religious Education year, we also have other programs for young children, including a Pre-K/Kindergarten Religious Education Class and a Nursery Program for toddlers and children through age three. My sponsor has shown me the way to His light and His love. I truly enjoy fishing; the water is very tranquil and relaxing. I love walking my dogs, and enjoying all of God's wonders.

Hello, my name is Emily Voorheis, and I was born in South Korea. I was adopted at the age of 6, and raised in Palatine. I grew up Methodist with my sister and two brothers. Wyeth and his family are Catholic, and that was how I became intrigued to learn more about the Catholic faith. I grew up going to Sunday School, and singing in the Church Choir right out of high school. Church and singing has been the building blocks that have brought me through some difficult times. When I was 15, my father developed some health problems that placed me as the “*head of the house*”. When I graduated from high school, I withdrew from attending a university, and stayed home to attend a community college. Family Matters

"If you love Me, keep My commandments." —John 14:15

Have you ever had a scene like this in your home? Following a family "blow-up", one child stands sullen and still, another is crying, none too quietly, perhaps a third child (or maybe it's a parent) sits pouting. Soon an adult voice announces, "So this will not happen again, I'm laying down the law." Then follows a list of tasks, duties, and responsibilities that are divided among all present. Each is asked to participate in the life of the family by helping with household chores. The chores may limit activity like TV viewing, or make going out to play somewhat delayed. Is it fear of consequences, or love of family that moves individual family members to say "yes"?

The first part of the "commandments" begins with the word "command", which implies a demand. *How do we look upon Jesus' commandments? Today's Gospel calls us to check out motives. Are we compelled by fear of punishment, or impelled by love? Do we read Jesus' commandments as restrictions on our freedoms, or invitations to demonstrate love?*
