“Then an argument broke out among them about which of them should be regarded as the greatest. Rather, let the greatest among you be as the youngest, and the leader as the servant. For who is greater: the one seated at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one seated at the table? I am among you as the one who serves.” (–Luke 22:23-27)

I encourage all of us to meditate on this passage, and its’ impact for our own lives and, in a special way, our thoughts as to what might be best for the future of our Parish, and our place in the renewal of the Church for the entire Chicagoland area. We are called to serve one another.
